Lauren Trojniar writes and teaches preschool in Austin, TX. **Susannah Felts** is on the faculty of SAIC's creative writing department, and she's a frequent contributor to the *Chicago Reader*, among other publications. **Gretchen Kalwinski** lives and writes in Chicago. Lately, her journalistic work has appeared, in addition to her fiction being featured at THE2NDHAND.com, in the *Venus* zine, *Time Out Chicago*, and a host of other publications. **Todd Dills** is the editor of THE2NDHAND, a part-time faculty member in Columbia College's fiction writing department, and likewise a member of the *Chicago Reader*'s editorial staff.
